Foundation Fellowship: Using strict criteria, your Board offered Foundation Fellowship status without examination to eminent and long-standing members of the Association in recognition of their significant contributions to IADT and the science of dental traumatology. 50 members have accepted this honor.

World Congress Brisbane, 2016: The Scientific Program Committee, under the leadership of Lamar Hicks (USA) and Stephen Harlamb (AU), have developed a wonderful three-day program. World renowned speakers will present, in sequence, the clinical events and professional activity that occurs over the entire timeline for the dental trauma patient starting with the trauma event, progressing through the evaluation and treatment planning phase, and on to urgent and non-urgent treatment strategies, patient follow up, complications and treatment outcomes. In addition, there will be sessions devoted to educators in dental traumatology, current research, and dental traumatology for the primary dentition, as well as poster and oral research sessions. This will be a conference to remember - August 11-13, 2016, Brisbane, Australia.

Log onto the <u>Member page</u> at <u>www.iadt-dentaltrauma.org</u> and check out the <u>Fellowship Tab</u>. The process of eligibility is now streamlined and payment is accepted electronically. Once accepted as 'Eligible' you can plan to sit the first online examination in June 2015. Access to the examination will be through a secure website and the examination must be completed in one sitting within a time limit of two hours. The examination will be in English and will use FDI tooth notation. The title of <u>Fellow of the International Association of Dental Traumatology</u> will be conferred on successful candidates.

I would like to thank all the members of the Fellowship Committee who have put in so much effort to establish eligibility criteria and to develop the examination to date, especially **Juan Onetto** who has taken the lead on the examination questions.


THE WORLD CONGRESSES 1998-2005: PART II

The **Ninth World Congress** on Dental Trauma convened in **Eilat, Israel** on October 20-23, 1998 under the auspices of the IADT and the Israel Association for Prevention and Treatment of Dental Trauma (Fig. 9). **Drs. Arieh Kaufman** and **Eliyahu Mass** had arranged an extensive program with practical demonstrations, lectures and a concluding symposium on a proposed IADT classification of root resorptions. A social highlight was an evening cruise on the Gulf of Aqaba in the Red Sea giving the participants an opportunity to see parts of 4 historic countries: Israel, Jordan, Egypt and Saudi Arabia, all converging on a relatively small area of the Red Sea (1).

The largest gathering of attendees for a trauma conference took place in **Melbourne**, **Australia** on March 19-21,1999 when the IADT and Australian Society of Endodontology, Inc. sponsored the **Tenth International Conference** with the theme of "Dental Injuries and their Impact on Health" under the chairmanship of **Dr. Barry Feiglin**. The Opening Ceremony, attended by over 750 dental health care providers, featured a most spectacular event: **Dr. Jens Ove Andreasen** was given the opportunity to demonstrate live how to replant an avulsed tooth right in front of the speaker podium! It was actually a stunt concocted by Dr. Feiglin in which an


"audiovisual technician" helping with "failing" microphone, tripped and supposedly knocked out his front tooth. It was a very realistic stunt and it took some time before the audience realized the deception. There were many excellent presentations on 'Acute Trauma Management' and the 'Psychological Effects of Trauma'. The hot topics included the introduction of Emdogain® by **Dr. Lars Hammarström** as a possible agent for use in root resorptions, and speculation by **Dr. Jens Ove Andreasen** about various methods for proliferating pulpal vasculature after trauma (thus predicting 'pulp regeneration') (2).

Oslo, the capital city of Norway, celebrated its 1000 year anniversary in 2000. IADT members who attended the **Eleventh World Congress** on Dental Trauma on June 22-24, 2000 joined in the celebrations. Over 300 attendees received current information about evidence-based treatment of dental injuries from about 30 experts, in addition to the many oral and poster presentations.

Announcement of World Congress in Boston, 2001

A large number of dentists representing two organizations, the Academy of Sports Dentistry (ASD) and the IADT, met in Boston, Massachusetts, USA June 20-24, 2001 for a combined meeting of the Twelfth World Congress on Sports Dentistry and Dental Traumatology. The co-chairs, Drs. Martin Trope (IADT) and Jack Winters (ASD) assembled a group of specialists from both disciplines and managed to arrange the 5-day schedule of lectures, oral and poster presentations, workshops, and social events in such a way to provide a full menu of events. It started with a day of current overview of dental trauma by **Dr. Jens Ove Andreasen**: 'State of the Art in Dental Traumatology for the New Millennium' and concluded on the last day with a workshop on mouth guard fabrication.

Coinciding with becoming President of the IADT, **Dr. Marie Therese Flores** also served as chair of the Thirteenth World Congress on Dental Traumatology in Santiago, Chile, October 8-10, 2003. With the intriguing theme of 'Networking the Evidence' the more than 600 participants from 23 countries benefitted from excellent presentations by lecturers spanning the globe. Because of its location the congress attracted many dentists from Argentina, Brazil and Chile. The emphasis on acute trauma was intentional to provide educational opportunities in this area of dentistry to many faculty members in new dental schools opening up in many areas of South America. Another area that is sometimes underemphasized is trauma to the primary dentition; that was not neglected at this conference.




Announcement for the 13thWorld Congress in Santiago, Chile.

Returning to Scandinavia, the **Fourteenth World Congress** on Dental Traumatology invited participants to Iceland on May 5-7, 2005. This small island in the North Atlantic with its Viking heritage provides an opportunity for viewing beauty both in nature and in art. Under the chairmanship of **Dr. Asgeir Sigurdsson**, an excellent program of lectures and short presentations focused on better understanding of the dynamics of dento-alveolar injuries with the goal of preserving injured tissues and returning patients to high levels of function and esthetics. Coinciding with the year the IADT founding president, **Dr. Jens Ove Andreasen** would celebrate his 70th birthday (3), it was appropriate at this congress to have Dr. Andreasen summarize from over 50 years of experience in dental trauma the current status of the discipline and pointing to the future of stem cell and regeneration studies.
