Education Remains a Top Priority


Dear IADT members,

During the last couple of months, Executive Officers, Board Directors and Special Committees have been working on several fronts in a combined effort promoting IADT's mission.

As previously reported, the 20th World Congress on Dental Traumatology (WCDT) will be held in August 2018 in San Diego, California. In recognition to the need for further education in dental traumatology, the American Association of Endodontists (AAE) has agreed to partner with the IADT and develop what we hope will be the best and largest World Congress on Dental Traumatology. Together, both organizations developed a Congress Organizing Committee (COC) and a Scientific Program Committee (SPC) with equal and balanced representation. Since then, significant progress was made particularly in developing an amazing scientific program featuring the best clinicians, researchers, and scholars from around the globe. I would like to thank Doctors Lamar Hicks and Fabricio Teixeira for their work chairing the COC, and Doctors. Liran Levin and Roberta Pillegi for their amazing work chairing the SPC and putting together a magnificent program. Stay tuned and make sure to save the dates August 16-18, 2018.

The IADT's Education Committee makes considerable effort in promoting and providing high quality dental trauma-related education for both the dental professionals as well as the general international community. The committee, chaired by Dr. Zafer C. Çehreli, uploaded free lectures for all members to the IADT website aimed at promoting dental trauma education among professional colleagues as well as trainers, coaches and physical education teachers. The lectures were developed and generously shared by Dr. Ulf Glendor and myself.

Considering that most traumatic injuries occur at school or during sport-related activities, education is critically important for first responders who are at the site of injury. Thus, the recently available lectures, developed for both professionals and non-professionals, provide our members with an easy way to educate members of your communities.






4- Dental Trauma Guide (DTG)

Dental Trauma Guide now available for free on your IADT Member Page

As many of you have already noticed, since January 2017 the new Dental Trauma Guide (DTG) has been updated to a new platform and has been charging an annual subscription fee of \$25 per person/year. The new subscription fee was implemented to support the significant expenses incumbent in continually updating and maintaining this extraordinary online resource. The IADT has contributed and supported the creation and development of the DTG since its inception. After discussions and a special agreement with DTG, we are pleased to announce that the Dental Trauma Guide can now be accessed directly from your IADT member page, under the new DTG Icon. This is a special benefit that the IADT was committed to offer to its members.

For easy access, please log on to your "IADT membership page" with your username and password. Scroll down the page and you will see Link to>> Dental Trauma Guide and a photograph of a password. Noting the password, which is case sensitive, press the link to Dental Trauma Guide and enter the password on the DTG website. At this point, you may have to allow pop ups. If you have not connected to the DTG online, be sure to look for a small narrow message at the top or bottom requesting permission to allow the pop up. If you are using a MAC, there may be a very tiny red x in the top right corner that will prompt you to allow pop ups.

Dues must be current to access the icons on your IADT Member page. Please contact the IADT Administration Office if you need assistance or have any questions.



5- Educating in a Neighborhood Soccer Club in Uruguay

As members of the IADT and representing the Postgraduate team of the Catholic University in Montevidéu-Uruguay, we decided to participate in a day of integration and play in the Carrasco Soccer League. This league includes several clubs categorized according to players' age from 7 to 17 years old. Our objective was to educate both the teams and the public on TDIs and make them aware of the need to incorporate mouthguards when practicing sports. We used posters and brochures and taught adults and children what to do in an emergency situation. The IADT "Save Your tooth" Poster was extremely helpful to inform them.

In Uruguay, our small country with 3.2 million inhabitants in South America bordering Argentina and Brazil, soccer and "garra charrua" are our national favorite sports. World-famous players like Luis Suárez, Edinson Cavani, Diego Godín, Fernando Muslera, Josema Jiménez, Martín Cáceres, as well as others, currently wear the celeste (sky blue) shirt of our national soccer team, as did Diego Forlán who won FI-FA's Golden Ball award in the 2010 World Cup. All our players were formed in neighborhood clubs. They were all part of the baby football teams and their leagues. "La Celeste", the uruguayan national soccer team, won many South American championships and multiple FIFA World Cups, including the first ever World Cup in 1930 as hosts. That's why we hope that by reaching these important neighboring soccer leagues, we can have a fruitful early impact and efficiently increase general awareness in the management of TDIs.
