

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

It has been an eventful time for the IADT during the last few months. Great progress has been made in the restructuring of the administrative aspects of the organization. The president of RES, Eben Yancey, and his staff have done a great job, updating the website, make joining and renewing membership much more user-friendly and guiding us in developing useful ways of communicating, such as using the GoToMeetings program for the officers and directors.

The future of the Association is very promising. With the development of a committee structure to carry on the activities of the Association, the mission of the IADT – to provide the best current information about dental trauma to patients and health care providers worldwide - will be more effectively accomplished. The new committees will play important roles in making dental traumatology an important component of health care through effective teamwork.

One of the committees, the Membership Committee, will promote membership by initiating and encouraging the presentation of continuing education courses in many areas around the world. Already there are plans for courses in Hangzhou, China and San Diego California in May, 2013, and in Copenhagen, Denmark in September 2013. *Watch the IADT website for announcements of these and other courses*.

Another big accomplishment this year was the publication of the revised IADT Dental Trauma Guidelines, both in this journal and on the IADT website. The revision was accomplished by multidisciplinary IADT committees ensuring input from all disciplines of dentistry. Recognizing the role played by so many areas of dentistry has resulted in the endorsement already of one specialty organization, the American Association of Endodontists. We are encouraging other associations to also endorse the Guidelines.

Finally, on a personal note I wish to express my deep appreciation to the IADT for allowing me to participate for many years in various positions in the organization, more recently as Executive Director. At the end of December, 2012 I stepped down, and the duties I have been handling for some years will now be carried out jointly by our Secretary/Treasurer (currently Dr. Lamar Hicks) and RES, Inc. We are very fortunate to have such a professional staff assist us in making our Association run smoothly.

17th World Congress in Rio de Janeiro Brazil

The 17th International Association of Dental Traumatology conference was held between 19-22nd September 2012 in Rio de Janeiro Brazil. What a spectacular event it was! Entitled the *Art and Science: Overcoming the limits of our knowledge* the Congress was held at the five star Windsor Barra Hotel on the Barra da Tijuca peninsula - excellent facilities, specular views and a beach across the road! International delegates could also incorporate trips to the famous landmarks of Rio, including Christ the Redeemer, Sugarloaf Mountain and the beaches of Copacabana and Ipanema.

Dr. Renato Lenzi and his organising committee spent years developing the excellent scientific and social program. Renato's infectious energy and hospitality ensured the event was a complete social and scientific success and that delegates feel very welcome.

We were given presentations of very high quality by both Brazilian and international speakers. Scientific poster presentations were also given by researchers from all over the world.

The Congess was preceded by an endodontic series from Penn University and held in parallel meeting of the Brazilian Maxillofacial Society. As part was a vibrant trade show IADT had its own booth, advertising the benefits of membership as well as Dental Trauma guide.

The opening ceremony included a lecture from the world famous designer Hans Donner and Brazilian salsa dancing. Brazilian cocktails, including Caipirnha – a mixture of rum and lime, were served. Some delegates took advantage of the nearby beachside bar to continue chatting late into the night.

On the last morning, the poster presentation was held. This allowed over one hundred delegates to present their research or clinical cases. Each delegate was allowed a four minute verbal presentation next to their poster followed by a number of questions from the judges. The proceedings were expertly organised by local scientific committee and Dr. Lamar Hicks, the secretary and treasurer of the IADT.
